RECOMMENDATIONS

• For the Metropolis Women International Network

We recommend that the Metropolis Women International Network should fully play its role as an upholder of morals and a companion within the context of elections all over the world, to ensure the place of women in electoral processes. Furthermore, the Metropolis Women International Network should not only ensure that women take their rightful place in decision-making bodies, but also a greater implementation of its antennae in every big city all over the world.

For women themselves, we recommend that they rise up and get more involved in the defence of their rights and obligations. Because no one is in a better position than oneself to defend one's interests.

• For decision makers

We recommend that decision makers should take into account the interests of women in national decisions, ensuring that signed and ratified international conventions are effectively applied in order to guarantee the legal security of women.
